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# PPE REQUIREMENTS FOR POLYURETHANES VERSUS NON-ISOCYANATE COATINGS: IS THERE REALLY A DIFFERENCE?

The word isocyanate on a product label or safety data sheet might prompt the selection of an alternative coating and in some cases, facility owners and/or contractors have reportedly been reluctant to specify/use polyurethane coatings, based upon a belief that coatings containing isocyanates have more stringent personal protective equipment requirements than those for application of coatings that do not contain isocyanates. This article describes a study conducted to investigate this belief and determine if recommended PPE requirements differ between polyurethane and non-isocyanate containing coatings.



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# THE EFFECT OF FEATHERING ON COATING PERFORMANCE

NAVSEA Standard Item (NSI) 009-32 defines feathering as tapering the edges of tightly adhering old paint at an approximate 30-degree angle into the newly prepared bare metal surface. This article describes a U.S. Naval Research Laboratory program designed to test the hypothesis that feathering does not affect repair coating system performance and discusses what this testing revealed.

#### **OSHA Releases Final Rule for Various Standards**

n May 13, OSHA issued a final rule, ultimately revising 14 provisions within recordkeeping, general industry, maritime and construction standards that might otherwise be confusing, outdated or unnecessary.

The Standards Improvements Project also aims to permit better compliance by employers and reduce various costs and paperwork burdens where applicable, without reducing employee protection.

As part of the final rule, OSHA has proposed and approved an update to the consensus standard for signs and devices used to protect workers when in proximity of automobile traffic. Additional construction-related changes include decreasing the minimum breaking-strength requirement for lifelines in safety belts, lifelines and lanyards.

However, OSHA has declined to revise the lockout/tagout and personal protective equipment standards or proposed changes to the excavation or underground construction standards, stating in its report, "that such a change to the PPE standard should occur in a separate rulemaking outside the limited SIP process."

Regarding health, OSHA has removed the requirement that employers provide periodic chest X-rays to screen for lung cancer in several standards, including: inorganic arsenic, coke-oven emissions

and acrylonitrile. Exceptions have been made for the screening requirements for asbestosis, however.

Additionally, employers are permitted to use digital radiography and other reasonably-sized standard films for X-rays for medical surveillance. OSHA has also updated the definition of when hearing loss is related to the workplace and revised pulmonary function testing.

In the event of a medical emergency, OSHA has reviewed methods used for calling emergency services, choosing to update the airborne concentration standards. This will require that employers have current technologies in the case of contacting an ambulance service while in areas with unreliable cell service.

As for sanitation standards and preventing infestation, after receiving some 500 comments from the public, OSHA has removed "feral cats" from its list of vermin in regard to shipyards; "insects, birds, other animals and rodents" remain, however.


The agency estimates that the SIP rulemakings will inspire various cost savings and paperwork reductions. After proposing these changes back in October 2016, the agency will see the rule take effect 60 days after its official publication in the Federal Register.



# Delamination of Coatings from Thin-Gauge Metal Sheeting

hin-gauge metal sheeting (including electrogalvanized, aluminum, copper and stainless steel) is commonly used in the building construction industry for flashing, building panels and decorative features. In many applications, the thin-gauge metal is painted, and problems arise when the surface preparation does not impart adequate surface roughness, or profile. Coating delamination can occur after exposure to temperature fluctuations where the thin-gauge metal expands and contracts or flexes.

This month's failure investigation was selected from several investigations related to failures that occurred on thin-gauge metal substrates. In all instances, the originally specified surface preparation methods (abrasive blast-cleaning or treatment with a phosphoric acid-based etchant) were revised to only require hand- and power-tool sanding prior to painting.

#### THE CASES

Epoxy primer and fluoropolymer finish systems exhibited delamination several months after installation. The coated thin-gauge metal surfaces had been subjected to significant temperature changes between summer months when the coating system was applied (surface temperatures up to I2O F), and cold winter temperatures (below freezing). The failures often originated at edges, seams, solder joints or on complex surfaces. The failures were most common on the south and west sides of the buildings where the highest temperatures would occur as a result of sun exposure.

Examination of the substrate showed varying degrees of surface scarification. In some cases, there were barely any scratches visible, while other areas had dense scratches. Whether significantly scarified or not, surface profile was almost always greater than I mil (25 µm).

The adhesion of the coating varied on all

structures that were examined. About half of the adhesion tests indicated good adhesion (ASTM D6677 value of 8 or IO), approximately 40% of the tests indicated poor coating adhesion (ASTM D6677 value of 0 or 2), and approximately IO% of the tests indicated moderate adhesion (ASTM D6677 value of 4 or 6). Coating adhesion often varied at any given location that was examined; that is, testing conducted a few inches away from delaminated coating and areas of poor adhesion revealed excellent adhesion.

Interestingly, one of the structures examined included thin-gauge electrogalvanized components that had been exposed to the atmosphere for an extended time prior to coating. The surface appeared typical of a weathered surface. The coatings applied to these surfaces were tightly adhered and no failures were observed.

All coating samples were collected and submitted to the laboratory for analysis. Cross-sectional microscopic examination revealed that there was no direct correlation between coating thickness and coating failure.

Examination of the back sides of the coating chips revealed varying degrees of intersecting lines that replicated surface scarification.

The laboratory analysis also included testing for evidence of bond breakers (such as grease or oil) on the back of the delaminated coating by rinsing the backs of several chips with hexane. The rinsing was analyzed by infrared spectroscopy. No appreciable amount of hydrocarbon was detected.

Interpretation of the field and laboratory test data concluded that the delamination was a result of inadequate surface preparation. While scarification (sanding) of the surface was performed in almost every area examined, the degree of scarification varied and was insufficient to withstand the stresses imparted by the expansion and contraction of the substrate.

#### DISCUSSION

In all instances, the originally specified and proven methods of surface preparation were abandoned and substituted with less rigorous




Fig. 2: Galvanized steel that has a moderate amount of scarification.

hand- and power-tool sanding. The reason for the change was to simplify the surface preparation process and avoid the logistics and costs associated with abrasive blast-cleaning.

In the building construction industry, abrasive blast-cleaning is frequently avoided because of the difficulty and cost of performing the operations outside of a shop. For instance, mild steel surfaces are usually prepared and primed in the shop and then touched-up and finish-painted in the field. Abrasive blast-cleaning typically requires costly containment to prevent the introduction of dust to the environment and is often done in conjunction with other construction activities making the process even more challenging.

Nevertheless, abrasive blast-cleaning remains one of the more commonly specified surface preparation methods for thin-gauge metal surfaces, which are typically required to be cleaned in accordance with SSPC-SPI, "Solvent Cleaning," and abrasive blast cleaning is specified to be performed in accordance with SSPC-SPI6, "Brush-Off Blast Cleaning of Coated and Uncoated Galvanized Steel, Stainless Steels and Non-Ferrous Metals."

In addition to the cost and logistical challenges associated with abrasive blast-cleaning, damage to the thin-gauge metal surfaces can occur if blasting is not executed properly. Thin-gauge metal may deform or buckle during brush-off blast cleaning. Deformation of thingauge metal substrates can be prevented by selecting softer abrasives, reducing the blast pressure, increasing the stand-off distance between the substrate and nozzle and moving the blast nozzle rapidly across the surface being roughened and cleaned.

While there are some chemical methods of surface preparation that can be used to properly prepare electrogalvanized surfaces, in some cases, these are ineffective. For example, galvanized metal can be treated with a phosphoric acid-based etchant in accordance with ASTM D6386, "Standard Practice for Preparation of Zinc (Hot-Dip Galvanized) Coated Iron and Steel Product and Hardware Surfaces for Painting." However, if the galvanized steel is chromate treated to prevent rusting during shipment and storage, then the etchant will typically not work.

When chromate pre-treatments are applied to galvanized steel, the phosphoric acid-based etchant is not effective in preparing the surface of galvanized steel since the galvanized surface is resistant to the chemical reaction that cleans and converts the galvanizing to a paintable surface.

Industry standards recommend that

galvanized steel scheduled to be painted be ordered without the chromate treatment. However, if the treatment is applied, then abrasive blast-cleaning is the only method for preparing the surface of galvanized steel prior to painting, unless the galvanized surfaces are weathered prior to coating.

Representative areas of galvanized surfaces to be coated should always be tested for the presence of chromates or other passivating treatments before the application of a phosphoric acid-based etchant. The testing is accomplished by applying a copper sulfate solution to the surface of the galvanized steel. If the spot turns black, there is no passivation layer present.

Because of the problems and costs associated with abrasive blast-cleaning and the ineffectiveness of the phosphoric acid treatment on chromate-treated electrogalvanizing, hand- and power-tool sanding has often been attempted to prepare thin-gauge metal surfaces, as it was in the cases cited here. This approach is often endorsed by the coating manufacturer, since off times surface-tolerant epoxy primers are used, and it is believed that these coatings will adhere to the scarified surfaces.

The use of hand- and power-tool sanding and grinding is discussed in ASTM D6386. The standard indicates that it is an acceptable method for preparing the surfaces of

galvanized steel. This approach has also been used on stainless steel and non-ferric metals (such as aluminum, copper and others). The problem with this method is that there is no standard that describes an acceptable condition of hand- or power-tool-cleaned thingauge substrates. Usually, the only imposed requirement is a nominal I-mil surface profile.

The problem with only specifying a surface profile depth is that it does not impose a peak density. As such, the degree of preparation tends to vary from one location to the next. Also, the surfaces requiring preparation are often complex, making consistent scarification impossible.

The decision to revise the surface preparation requirements must often be endorsed by the coating manufacturer and agreed upon by the asset

owner. Most manufacturers today have surface-tolerant coatings that are reported to adhere to minimally prepared surfaces. However, the probability of success is directly related to the degree of surface preparation and the inherent expansion and contraction of the substrate created by the service environment.

The selected coating system also impacts the

probability of success. For example, an acrylic system imparts substantially lower stress at the substrate interface and can adhere with a minimal amount of scarification. However, when an epoxy primer is used in a fluoropolymer system, a more rigorous method of creating a surface profile—including peak density—is required because the epoxies impart significantly higher stress at the substrate interface as they crosslink and cure. Further, a cross-linked coating system will be more rigid and less tolerant of thermal movement and flexing.

#### **OTHER CONSIDERATIONS**

It is important to minimize the specified thickness, especially when epoxy primers are used. Except for steel sheeting, which is much less common, the other substrates are already corrosion-resistant in most environments, and the purpose of coating is primarily aesthetics. Therefore, thick epoxy applications are not required, and a 2–5-mil application is sufficient as a barrier coat.

#### **FAILURE REMEDIATION**

In the case studies discussed, once the cause of the coating delamination had been determined, appropriate remediation methods needed to be developed. Based on the available information, abrasive blast-cleaning was selected. Given that the substrates were relatively thin, the challenge was to develop an approach that would adequately profile the surface without deforming it, so field testing was performed to determine an optimum approach.

Vapor blast-cleaning was the method suggested for preparing the surfaces to minimize containment. Vapor-blasting utilizes a conventional expendable abrasive and a water-vapor spray. It removes coatings, contaminants, oxidation, corrosion and residues from hard surfaces. It is similar to wet abrasive blast-cleaning, except that it reduces airborne dust and uses significantly less water. In many cases, the water evaporates before it reaches the ground.

Copper test panels were selected to perform the field testing because copper was

the softest of the thin-gauge metals and was believed to deform more easily than the other substrates. Five different types of blast-cleaning abrasives were used for the testing, with sizes ranging from I2/20 to 70/I40. Blast pressures ranged from 30–55 psi. Each of the methods were evaluated by visual examination for damage to the copper panels such as buckling, surface-profile depth, qualitative peak density assessments and production rate.

Surface-profile readings were obtained in accordance with ASTM D44I7, "Standard Test Methods for Field Measurement of Surface Profile of Blast Cleaned Steel, Method C-Replica Tape Method." The evaluation revealed that the condition of the prepared surfaces varied significantly depending upon which media was used and which blast-nozzle air pressure was used. Some of the tests resulted in buckling of the copper sheets, while others could not impart a dense anchor pattern. It was concluded that the most effective method for preparing the copper

surfaces was the use of 40/70 crushed glass at a nominal nozzle pressure of 50 psi (yellow highlighted row in Table I). This method was selected because it provided an acceptable profile with no evidence of damage to the copper. The results of the testing are provided in Table I.

The procedure was then tested in the field on the actual thin-gauge metal surfaces. When the surface preparation was performed in accordance with the test requirements, the surfaces were prepared without deformation, and the applied coatings were well-adhered.

#### CONCLUSION

A combination of surface profile and peak density are very important when preparing any substrate, including thin-gauge metal, which tends to expand and contract more than metals with a thicker cross section. Hand- or power-sanding or scarifying can produce an inconsistent surface roughness that does not contain the density of peaks necessary for bonding of coatings that chemically cross-link and become very hard once cured. However, abrasive blastcleaning can significantly distort thingauge metal, so optimizing the abrasive type and size, blast-nozzle pressure, nozzle-to-workpiece distance and dwell time are all important prior to production activities. Use of acid-based etchants may be possible on electrogalvanized sheeting, provided the surfaces have not been chromate-treated. Finally, optimizing coating film thickness is also important. The thinnest coating film that will still provide protection and aesthetic value is preferred to minimize the stresses impaired at the coating/substrate interface.

# ARE YOU A COMPETENT PERSON—AND WHAT DOES THAT MEAN, ANYWAY?

SHA regulations, specifications, standards and other documents often refer to the "competent person." You may believe you are a competent person because you took a class or because someone gave you that title, but that is not necessarily the case.

What does it actually mean? When is a competent person required? Do employers and the assignee understand the roles and responsibilities, as well as the risks, when performing or assigning duties to a competent person?

A "competent person" is defined by OSHA in 29 CFR I926.32(f) as "one who is capable of identifying existing and predictable hazards in the surroundings or working conditions which are unsanitary, hazardous or dangerous to employees, and who has authorization to take prompt corrective measures to eliminate them."

Some industrial painting operations that require competent persons under existing OSHA standards applicable to construction (29 CFR) are listed in Table I (p. I4). Similar requirements apply to general industry and shipyards.

The lead, cadmium, beryllium and silica standards also add a few requirements. Some standards (such as those for scaffolding and excavation) have additional training requirements for the competent person. The SSPC QP 2 definition adds the public and the environment to those who are to be protected and requires specific initial and annual training and experience.

When you add it all up, there are two distinct parts to being a competent person.

- I. Capability/Competence: One must be able to identify existing and predictable hazards in the surroundings or working conditions that are unsanitary, hazardous or dangerous to employees, the public and/or the environment, including existing and potentially hazardous coatings or materials. This person must also have the knowledge and ability to employ the proper control methods to protect workers and fulfill responsibilities as defined by the standard.
- Designation/Authorization: The person is designated by the employer to act on the employer's behalf and has the authorization to take prompt corrective measures to eliminate hazards.

The comprehensive health standards identify additional duties and responsibilities of a competent person to include at least the following:

· Determining when hazardous coatings are

- present in the workplace, prior to the performance of work;
- Establishing and demarcating, where necessary, regulated areas and assuring that access to and from those areas is limited to authorized employees;
- Assuring the adequacy of any employee exposure monitoring required by this standard;
- Assuring that all employees exposed to hazardous coatings above the PEL wear appropriate personal protective equipment and are trained in the use of appropriate methods of exposure control;
- Assuring that proper hygiene facilities are provided and that workers are trained to use those facilities;
- Assuring that the engineering controls required by this standard are designed, implemented, maintained in proper operating condition, and functioning properly; and
- Performing frequent and regular inspections of jobsites, materials and equipment.

#### COMPETENCE/CAPABILITY

Being the competent person is more than a job title, role or designation—it creates a legal obligation for the person assigned or performing the role. He or she needs to be qualified to identify the hazards associated with a particular operation. Multiple competent persons with varying degrees of training and experience may be required on a typical industrial paint project.

Competence is generally the knowledge that comes from a combination of skills, direct experience and training. Some certification bodies require competent persons to obtain hours of initial training, years of work experience and annual refresher training—but does that alone make someone a competent person? The answer is no.

OSHA (in a standard interpretation on scaffolding) recognizes that successful completion of a course does not, alone, necessarily establish an individual as a competent person for a number of reasons. By its terms, the definition of a competent person compels the employer to select an employee based upon his or her capability to identify hazards. The course may not be sufficiently comprehensive with respect

to the information needed to meet the knowledge requirement in the definition. Remember that the type and extent of knowledge required will vary based on what is necessary to successfully perform the task in the standard. Also, the course may not adequately test the employee's understanding of the course material.

Passing a course alone does not determine one's competency. Competence is demonstrated, not certified. Part of that demonstration entails being able to perform the required functions, such as immediately identifying and correcting any hazards that may appear. If that person is unable or unwilling to do so, he or she would not fit the definition of competent person.

OSHA compliance officers will be quick to tell you that not every-one meets the "competent person" designation. The fact is that nobody is competent in all areas of safety. General safety courses such as the OSHAIO- and 30-hour courses are good for general education, but do not deeply address areas in which competency is required.

So, how does one assess competency? It should include a task-based assessment of the work-related skills and behaviors needed to perform the duties of a competent person. For example, shown an unacceptable jobsite condition, can the competent person recognize it, know what to do about it and how to document it?

#### AUTHORIZATION/ DESIGNATION

A competent person must not only recognize hazards, but also be in a position to mitigate them. Employersmust identify, designate and authorize competent persons to take corrective action. Because many different types of activities can take place on a worksite, a competent person must either have the authority to make safety-related changes to those different operations or be able to enforce that changes are made by others.

Based on this author's observations, nearly every industrial painting contractor has authorized a "safety guy" or "competent person" for lead, scaffolding and other operations and can show you the memo and certificate to prove it. However, too often they fall into one of two groups, neither of which meets the intent of the definition of a competent person.

I. Competent, But Not Authorized: The "safety guy" or "competent person" is allowed to put up signs and fill out checklists, but rarely authorized to take meaningful action such as shutting down production or changing engineering controls. Often his or her suggestions or recommendations require approval

- of the foreman or production supervisors or are dismissed out of hand as too costly. If the competent person can't effect change through stopping work, requiring training, purchasing equipment or adjusting controls and work practices without permission from someone in production or project management, he or she is not a competent person.
- 2. Authorized, But Doesn't Care or Won't Take Action: In this case, the competent person is really a production supervisor, foreman or other worker but wearing the title of competent person. This person is generally too busy to take action or considers working conditions that are unsanitary, hazardous, or dangerous to employees, public and environment to be insignificant compared to production matters. If the competent person won't identify and document issues or take corrective action regarding predictable hazards, he or she is not competent person.

#### CONCLUSION

Competent persons generally are the employer's most knowledgeable official on-site when it comes to identifying and eliminating hazards.

During investigations, OSHA and SSPC auditors generally identify and interview competent persons to identify their competency and authority and interview employees to determine if they know who competent persons are for various hazards.

Do you know who your competent persons are? Have you formally documented who is the competent person for the hazards on your jobsite? Are these individuals truly competent and authorized to protect your liability and workforce? If not, it's time to act.

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socyanates are reactive chemicals often used in foams, elastomers, fibers and polyurethane paints. Exposure to isocyanates has been reportedly linked to irritation of the mucous membranes of the eyes, gastrointestinal and respiratory tracts. More serious health effects include asthma and inflammation of the lungs. In the protective coatings industry, exposure to isocyanates may occur during the mixing or application of polyurethane paints. The word isocyanate on a product label or safety data sheet (SDS) might prompt the user/specifier to select an alternative coating such as a product labeled as green or environmentally friendly. In some cases, facility owners and/or contractors have reportedly been reluctant to specify or use polyurethane coatings, based upon the belief that coatings containing isocyanates have more stringent personal-protective-equipment (PPE) requirements than those for application of coatings that do not contain isocyanates. A study was conducted to investigate this belief and determine if recommended PPE requirements differ between polyurethane and non-isocyanate-containing coatings.

#### **EVALUATION METHODS**

The study included the evaluation of 22 coating systems, falling into six coating groups: polyure-thanes (containing isocyanates), epoxies, zincs,

polysiloxanes, alkyd products and acrylic products. For each of the 22 coating systems, seven products from at least three manufacturers were selected, for a total of 154 products.

Each product was evaluated according to its product/technical data sheet (PDS/TDS) and its SDS. The assessment of the PDS/TDS focused on the recommended application method (spray or brush/roller) and intended use(s), generally, industrial maintenance painting, concrete flooring and/or automotive refinishing.

The assessment of the SDSs focused on the PPE requirements of each product, and in turn, these PPE requirements focused on four categories: hand protection, skin/body protection, eye/face protection and respiratory protection. For each of the four categories of PPE, the requirements were classified into one of the following categories:

- 1. PPE is not required (or not addressed).
- PPE use is dependent upon concentration of the hazardous components during use, the tasks performed, or the site-specific conditions, (i.e., use PPE, as appropriate).
- PPE is required (type may be specified or unspecified).

These PPE requirement categories are illustrated visually in Table 1 (p. 16).

The PPE requirements (of the 154 products evaluated) falling into each category illustrated in Table 1 were tallied for each of the six coating groups. The PPE requirement with the largest number of products was identified as the predominant PPE requirement for that coating group. For example, if a coating group was composed of 28 products and 21 of them required eyewear, the eye/face requirement for this coating group would be listed in red (eyewear required).

# PPE REQUIREMENTS NOT SPECIFIC TO APPLICATION TYPE

The predominant PPE requirement for each coating group is illustrated in Table 2 (p. 16). As shown, PPE requirements between polyure-thanes and non-isocyanate-containing paints did not differ. Generally, PPE requirements across all six coating groups were classified as yellow (PPE use is dependent upon concentration of the hazardous components during use, the tasks performed or the site-specific conditions). Only eye/face protection was classified as red (required by the SDSs across all six coating groups).

In the few cases where differences in PPE requirements between coating groups were found, PPE requirements for the non-isocyanate-containing coatings were more stringent than the polyurethane coating requirements. Specifically, the alkyd products (hand, skin/body protection) and acrylic products (hand protection in half of the evaluated SDSs)

required more stringent protection compared to the polyurethanes.

For all six coating groups, the use of eye/ face protection was a consistent requirement, whereas, most product SDSs did not require a specific type of protective glove, clothing or respirator. Many SDSs indicated that the use of protective gloves, clothing or respirator be based on the findings of a risk assessment (RA), site-specific conditions or the performance of a specific task such as spray painting.

Although little variability was identified between coating groups, some did exist within the coating groups (i.e., between the 22 different coating systems) and most was identified for hand and clothing requirements (Table 2). Hand PPE requirements varied primarily between always required or dependent upon site-specific conditions. Among the 22 coating systems, 46% (71) of the SDSs reguired hand protection while for 53% (82) of the SDSs, the requirements were dependent upon the site-specific conditions and one SDS did not require any hand protection.

The greatest variability was found between clothing PPE requirements. The SDS for 55% (85) of the products required protective clothing, while for 37% (57) the requirements were dependent upon site-specific conditions, and for 8% (12) the SDS did not require protective clothing.

Respirator requirements varied the least out of the PPE requirements. Most respiratory requirements (88%) were vaguely dependent

upon conditions (for example, instructing to use respiratory protection as appropriate). However, many SDSs did require respiratory protection under specific circumstances (for example, if concentrations of hazardous components are unknown, if applying the coating in a confined space or with insufficient ventilation). In the absence of any of these special circumstances, the majority of SDSs did not require respirator use for any of the 22 different coating systems.

#### SPRAY APPLICATION PPE REQUIREMENTS

The same evaluation process was repeated for all products to identify specific PPE requirements during spray application. SDSs for 18% (27) of the evaluated products contained PPE requirements specific to spray application. For those 27 products, respirator protection was required during spray application. In addition to an increase in respiratory protection, one product specifically required additional clothing protection during spray application.

Though an increase in respirator requirements for spray application was noted for 27 products, there was no change to the overall classification of requirements between general respirator requirements (not specific to application type) and those specified during spray application—the PPE requirements between polyurethanes and non-isocyanate-containing paints did not differ even when the requirements were assessed by method of application.

#### DISCUSSION

The primary route of entry for toxins during coating application is via the respiratory system. Coating application tasks can result in inhalation exposure to vapors and mists during mixing, application and curing following application1. During spray-painting operations, workers are at a greater risk of inhalation exposure compared to brush/roller application. Therefore, although not required by the majority of SDSs, best painting practice suggests a respirator should be worn during spray application of the coatings assessed in this evaluation. The type of respirator selected should protect against the exposure levels of the hazardous components in each product, determined through personal air monitoring. This recommendation falls in line with the SSPC painting manual, Good Painting Practice recommendation to wear goggles and the proper respiratory protection when spray painting or performing any operation where an abnormal amount of vapor or dust is formed2.

When selecting a respirator, product users should consider the specific hazardous materials in the product along with the added effect of the hazardous components in the product being used concurrently. The use of respirators as the sole means of compliance is not recommended. The use of engineering controls must be evaluated and implemented before relying on PPE.

Components of each product were identified as hazardous if the following criteria were met:

- Components were included in the SDS (per the OSHA Globally Harmonized System requirements);
- Components were identified in the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health Pocket Guide to Chemical Hazards (NPG) and;
- Per the NPG, appropriate preventive measures to reduce or eliminate adverse health effects and accidental injuries were included.

Many of the hazardous components, such as organic solvents identified for each product, required all forms of PPE (eye and/or skin and/or respiratory) per the NPG's suggested preventative measures. The chemicals or substances contained in the NPG include all substances

for which NIOSH has recommended exposure limits and those with permissible exposure limits as found in the OSHA General Industry Air Contaminants Standard (29 CFR 1910.1000). However, although a component of a product may not have an REL or PEL, worksite industrial hygienists/safety professionals or product users must evaluate all workplace chemical hazards, including those hazards not presently covered by an established limit.

#### CONCLUSIONS

Based on the classification system described in this article, the results of the evaluation indicate the PPE requirements specified in SDSs did not substantively differ between polyurethanes and non-isocyanate-containing coating systems.

Only the alkyd products (hand, skin/body protection) and acrylic products (hand protection in half the evaluated SDSs) required more stringent protection compared to the polyure-thanes. Protective eyewear was required across all coating groups. Although an SDS may not require PPE, it is recommended practice to wear appropriate PPE until personal-exposure monitoring determines the chemical hazards are below the occupational exposure limits.

Although little variability was found between the six coating groups, variability did exist within the coating systems comprising these six groups. An increase in respiratory protection was required during the spray application of 18% of the products, but overall this variability did not result in a significant difference in PPE requirements during the application of the coatings by spray or brush/roller.

Although not readily apparent in Table 2 and not a specific component of this study, the assessment of the 154 SDSs revealed that the detail and quality of the SDSs varied considerably between manufacturers. Little variability was identified among SDSs supplied by the same manufacturers, i.e., in general, manufacturers did not alter the PPE requirements between products in different coating groups. In addition, many of the SDSs left uncertainty regarding PPE requirements. Except for the eyewear requirements, most glove, clothing and respiratory requirements were recommended as appropriate (i.e., dependent upon the concentration of the hazardous components, the

task, site-specific conditions or required a risk assessment). Therefore, the SDS authors avoided definitively specifying PPE. The SDS language was generally crafted in a way to defer the responsibility of determining the appropriate PPE to the workplace industrial hygienist/safety professional or the product end user.

Although not always requiring PPE, many polyurethane SDSs contained special isocyanate warning statements. For example, individuals with lung or breathing problems or prior reaction to isocyanates must not be exposed to vapor or spray mist. Hazardous-component warning statements were not found in the evaluated SDSs for non-isocyanate-containing coating systems.

Conclusions drawn from the assessment of reported PPE requirements for the products evaluated during this study may not be applicable to other products on the market or future products.

Even if not specified in the SDS, good practice dictates that gloves, goggles and a face mask should always be used when applying any coating.




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eedback from waterfront personnel performing maintenance painting for the U.S. Navy has
consistently questioned
the Navy's requirement
for performing feathering.
NAVSEA Standard Item

(NSI) 009-32¹ defines feathering as tapering the edges of tightly adhering old paint at an approximate 30-degree angle into the newly prepared bare metal surface and requires that the contractor "feather edges of well-adhered paint remaining after cleaning for all surface preparation methods."

The requirement is impractical because feathering at a 30-degree angle on a 20-mil-thick coating would only give a 40-mil-wide feathered border. Performing and inspecting work to this requirement is not feasible. Feathering is a time-consuming and laborious process, which is further complicated by the legacy requirements, causing extensive rework on maintenance-painting jobs. Figure 1 shows an example of feathering performed as part of surface preparation to SSPC-SP 3² prior to application of the repair coating system

in a void space.

The U.S. Naval Research Laboratory performed an industry survey to better define feathering and improve or clarify the Navy's requirements. During this literature review, a February 2015 article in JPCL written by Mark Dromgool was found<sup>3</sup>. The article focuses on effective maintenance-painting practices for offshore structures and states the following.

"Importantly, the surface preparation ought not to include feathering the edges of the existing coating as this will stress the bond at the critical point: the juncture where the coating has been fractured and where the bare substrate is exposed. By all means, ensure that the edge that has been reached is sound, but then stop there. The only areas [to feather are] where an adverse aesthetic situation might exist in highly visible areas. The extra time and effort to perform a low yielding task like feathering edges would be better spent on actual surface preparation on other breakdown zones."

This position on the importance (or rather unimportance) of feathering was unique in the literature review, as feathering seemed to be a best practice both in industry and within

the military when performing repair work.
Feathering was commonly cited as important for smooth transition and adequate adhesion of new coating systems and for ensuring legacy coatings were sound and adherent.

NRL designed a program to test the hypothesis that feathering does not affect repair coating system performance. No quantitative data was found to support or refute the need for feathering, only anecdotal data. The objective of the NRL test program included the following:

- Determine the impact of feathering on longterm coating performance in repair areas;
- Collect metrics associated with the labor costs for performing feathering;
- Define feathering and the optimal feathering process that can be contractually invoked by the Navy without incurring increased rework costs; and
- Weigh the potential benefits of feathering with the associated costs in a cost-benefit analysis to determine if feathering is a value-added step in the repair process.

#### **EXPERIMENTAL PROCEDURE**

To ensure that the evaluation of feathering was comprehensive, testing was broken down into two different scenarios: laboratory testing and an industrial demonstration on a mock ballast tank.

Primary surface preparation in this effort was defined as the method/tool used to remove the failed legacy coating and achieve the specified SSPC surface-preparation cleanliness standard on the exposed substrate area. The primary surface preparation method was used to remove all compromised coating around the repair area until intact, tightly adherent paint was reached. Feathering was defined as a secondary preparation step performed after the primary surface preparation method was complete.

The testing defined three primary surface-preparation methods for performing coating repair.

- Spot-abrasive blasting with 36mesh virgin aluminum oxide mineral grit. Spots met SSPC-SP 6 level of cleanliness<sup>4</sup>.
- Spot power-tool preparation using a needle gun. Spots met SSPC-SP 15 level of cleanliness<sup>5</sup>.
- Spot power-tool preparation using a bristle-impact tool. Spots met SSPC-SP 15 level of cleanliness.

The feathering procedures were defined based on the literature review and industry best practice for feathering.

- Power-tool feathered: Feather 1–2 inches back from the bare substrate onto the intact coating to create a smooth transition using a rotary sander or grinder with 100-grit paper.
- Hand-tool feathered: Scuff sand by hand, a 1-inch-wide strip around the border of the intact coating with a 100grit sanding block.
- Not feathered: No secondary preparation required.

#### LABORATORY TESTING Specimens and Matrix

A total of 108 steel panels (ASTM A36 grade<sup>6</sup>) were abrasive-blasted to SSPC-SP 10<sup>7</sup> cleanliness using garnet abrasive to a 2–3-mil surface profile. Profile-depth readings were taken on each panel in accordance with ASTM D4417 Method B<sup>8</sup> and SSPC-PA 17<sup>9</sup>. The average profile was 2.7 mils.






Fig. 2: Panels after primary surface preparation. From left, two spot-abrasive blast and two power-tool methods.

Two different types of legacy coatings were used on the panels (Table 1). Coatings were applied via airless spray in accordance with

the manufacturer product data sheets. Dryfilm-thickness (DFT) measurements were taken on each panel in accordance with ASTM D7091<sup>10</sup> and SSPC-PA 2<sup>11</sup>.

#### **Artificial Pre-Weathering**

A razor knife was used to score the holiday area, exposing bare substrate. All panels were then pre-weathered by subjecting them to 300 hours in ASTM G85-A5 cyclic-salt-fog testing<sup>12</sup>.

# Primary Surface Preparation and Feathering

Upon removal from salt fog, the holiday in each panel was spot-prepared with the primary surface preparation method. Multiple solvent wipes and freshwater rinses were used as necessary to meet the cleanliness standard.

Spot-blasted panels and power-tooled panels were prepared to SSPC-SP 6 and SP 15 cleanliness standards, respectively (Fig. 2). Surface-profile depth was measured as before. The average profile of the spot abrasive-blasted panels was 2.1 mils, the average profile of the needle-gun panels was 2.5 mils and the average profile of the bristle-impact panels was 1.4 mils.

One-third of each set of panels was feathered in accordance with each of the three secondary feathering procedures listed previously.

The non-feathered panels maintained their original appearance because no secondary preparation was performed. The amount of time to complete the primary and secondary preparation on each panel was timed and recorded.

A high-solids (HS) epoxy repair coating system was applied using a ¼-inch-nap synthetic roller in a single coat to each panel in accordance with the manufacturer's product data sheets. The average DFT in the repair area was 9.3 mils. Panels were scribed using a ½-inch-diameter-mill bit so

that the scribe intersected the repair area diagonally, extending past the transition zone.

Half of the panels were subjected to 10 cycles (20 weeks) of modified ASTM D5894 cyclic salt fog/UV exposure test<sup>13</sup>. The test included a one-day exposure each week in a refrigerated chamber at a temperature of ~-20 C, which is the modification from ASTM D5894. The other panels were subjected to an alternate natural seawater exposure, consisting of a 12-hour dry/12-hour wet cycle, for 20 weeks.

#### INDUSTRIAL MOCK-BALLAST-TANK DEMONSTRATION

To gain experience and test data in an industrial environment and augment the laboratory testing, a demonstration was conducted on a mock steel ballast tank located in Norfolk, Virginia.

All prior loose and failed coating was removed from the mock tank. The average DFT of the existing coatings on the mock tank was 41.2 mils with readings ranging from 21.7–63.5 mils depending on the location. Twenty-one 1-foot squares were laid out across the tank walls, seven squares for each feathering method. A razor knife was used to score the coating system down to the steel around the periphery of the square. Multiple coats of legacy paint were present.

A heat-induction unit and a 4.5-inch, coarse, rapid-strip disc were used to remove the coating from inside the test patch. The test patches were sprayed with artificial seawater weekly to pre-weather for one month and allow the build-up of corrosion product and undercutting of the exposed coating edges.

After the pre-weathering step, the entire tank was washed with freshwater to remove salt and rust deposits via low-pressure water-cleaning (LP WC) as defined by the SSPC-SP WJ surface preparation standards<sup>14</sup>. All patches were then prepared to SSPC-SP 15 using a bristle-impact tool. All loose and failed coating was removed until tightly adherent coating was reached. The edges of the coating were probed with a dull putty knife to determine adherence. Profile depth was measured as before. Average profile depth was 1.7 mils.

Seven test patches were prepared per the feathering methods described previously

was employed.

(Fig. 3). The amount of time to complete the primary and secondary preparation steps on each test patch was recorded. A final solvent wipe was completed, and soluble salt readings were taken using the Bresle patch method on every test patch with an average result of 65 microsiemens.

One coat of the same UHS epoxy repair coating used for lab testing was applied to test patches 1–14. The repair coating was overlapped a minimum of 2 inches onto the intact coating on all sides. One coat of the polyamide epoxy repair coating used for lab testing was applied to test patches 15–21. A second coat of polysiloxane topcoat was applied to test patches 15–21 to complete the two-coat system (Fig. 4). All coatings were applied using a ¼-inchnap synthetic roller. The average DFT of the one-coat UHS epoxy repair system was 15.1 mils and the average DFT of the two-coat epoxy/polysiloxane repair system was 12.5 mils.

#### RESULTS Laboratory Testing

VISUAL/DESTRUCTIVE RATINGS




Fig. 5: Visual results after 20 weeks of cyclic accelerated testing.

Laboratory test panels were destructively inspected after 20 weeks of exposure in the two respective environments. Panels were rated visually for rust-through and blistering in accordance with ASTM D61015 and ASTM D71416, respectively. Cutback was measured at the maximum point of visual corrosion product after destructive removal of the coating adjacent to the scribe. All panels were probed for coating disbondment at the coating transition area and in the center repair area. Figure 5 shows the results of destructive testing and visual inspection of the laboratory panels subjected to twenty weeks of cyclic accelerated testing.




Fig. 6: Visual Results after 20 weeks of alternate seawater immersion testing.

Figure 6 shows the results of the destructive testing and visual inspection of the laboratory test panels subjected to 20 weeks of alternate seawater immersion.




Fig. 7: Cutback results from immersion and cyclic testing.

The maximum cutback measured at the scribe was averaged across the coating systems and binned into two groups: primary and secondary prep methods. The data was then plotted against each unique primary/secondary method in order to identify any independent variables that might be influencing coating performance (Fig. 7, p. 22). The cyclic testing showed little variation for both methods; however, alternate immersion panels showed significantly

prep method and when power-tool feathering

**AVERAGED QUANTITATIVE RESULTS**

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



Fig. 8: Rust-through rating for immersion and cyclic testing.

The rust-through ratings were also averaged and binned in the same manner. A rating scale of 0–10, where 10 equals no rust-through, was used to assign a condition for each panel. Alternate immersion did not distinguish any performance differences in terms of primary or secondary preparations methods. The cyclic testing again showed that the best primary prep method was spot-abrasive blast, as one would expect (Fig. 8, p. 22).




Fig. 9: Blister results from immersion and cyclic testing.

Finally, blister ratings were averaged and binned as above; a visual blister rating of 0–10 was assigned to each panel, where 10 equaled no blistering. ASTM D714 size and density ratings were combined and normalized for plotting purposes; the blister data is plotted in Figure 9 (p. 23).

Both cyclic and full-immersion testing exhibited the same trends with both prep methods. There was little difference observed across the three feathering methods.

Overall, the evaluations showed no notable variation between the feathering methods except in cutback rating where the standard power-tool feathering method proved to be a detriment. It should be noted that power-tool feathering was noticeably worse when used in combination with spot-abrasive blast as the

primary prep method. This phenomenon is observed because the blasted profile is polished by the rotary tool.

#### STATISTICAL FINDINGS AND CONCLUSION

Statistical software was used to perform analysis of variance (ANOVA) general linear model (GLM) with Tukey Honest Significant Difference (HSD) post-hoc tests. This was done on the averaged values to determine the significant independent variables (i.e., feathering method, primary prep method) influencing the inspection ratings and measurements (the dependent variable) seen in each experiment to a 95-percent confidence band (p < 0.05).

None of the feathering methods was identified as being statistically significant from any other feathering method. In other words, we can say with 95-percent confidence that of the three feathering methods employed, there is no difference in performance. Spotabrasive blasting was identified as being statistically significant in terms of better overall coating performance when compared to the two power-tool preparation methods, which was expected.

Analysis of the data showed an average labor savings of 15 percent by not feathering. The savings differed based on the coating type. The higher film thickness and tougher UHS epoxy was harder to feather and increased primary and secondary preparation time indicating the savings afforded by not feathering may be higher for UHS coatings.

#### INDUSTRIAL MOCK-BALLAST-TANK DEMONSTRATION

The industrial mock-ballast-tank demonstration was inspected at 12 months after the

repair coatings were applied. The mock tank had been sprayed with artificial seawater twice a week for two months to simulate sea spray. Each test patch was rated visually for rust-through and blistering as before. The test patches were probed for lifting edges or disbondment at the transition area. Tables 2 and 3 (p. 22) show the results of the inspection for rust-through and lifted coating. There was no evidence of blistering observed.


The rust-through results are an average of the rating of all seven test patches for the particular feather method. Rust-through was observed predominantly in the bare steel repair area immediately adjacent to the intact legacy coating. This phenomenon held true for all areas whether feathering was performed or not. All feathering methods showed equivalent minor coating breakdown. The hand-toolfeathered areas showed the greatest amount of lifting. The areas repaired with the two-coat system showed no breakdown and very little lifting, while the one-coat UHS epoxy primer showed minor breakdown and more substantial lifting. This suggests that a two-coat system (even with a lower overall DFT) may perform better in repair scenarios than a single-coat repair system. Analysis of the productivity data showed that on average, the non-feathered test patches took 10-20 percent less time to prepare than the hand-toolfeathered or power-tool-feathered patches.

#### CONCLUSIONS

The current Navy requirement in NSI 009-32 for feathering to a 30-degree angle is not achievable from a technical standpoint and is impractical to perform and inspect. By changing this requirement to a 1–2-inch border on the intact coating around the repair area, the quality assurance and quality control inspection requirements are reduced and simplified. This will prevent disagreements between contractors and inspectors over the intent and definition of the legacy requirement, with the end result being less rework.

NRL testing showed that feathering as a secondary-surface-preparation step is a non-value-added step in the touch-up process (i.e., feathering does not positively impact coating service life for the associated

#### THE EFFECT OF FEATHERING ON COATING PERFORMANCE

cost). Feathering is not necessary for spaces that do not require aesthetically pleasing repair coatings such as tanks and voids, and machinery spaces, as feathering has been shown to not influence nor increase the longevity of the coating system. Laboratory testing and the industrial demonstration both showed consistent results when comparing

specified SSPC surface-preparation standard using the primary preparation method. The data does show that instead of feathering, time would be better spent cleaning and preparing the surface to a higher surface-preparation cleanliness level or applying additional paint to the repair area. For example, there was a noted susceptibility across all feathering methods

which feathering will be defined as being used primarily for cosmetic or aesthetic reasons and will no longer be required in tanks, voids, machinery spaces or bilges.

the performance of non-feathered repair areas to feathered repair areas. The laboratory testing and the industrial demonstration both showed between 10–25-percent labor savings when feathering was not performed.

It should be stressed that removal of the feathering step does not nullify the requirement to remove all loose paint and corrosion product, which shall be performed to the for pinholes to develop at the transition area from intact coating to bare steel. Application of a stripe coat along the repair perimeter to mitigate this effect might add more value than performing feathering. This would not necessarily need to be a step added to the process but could be applied just prior to the full coat.



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quipment selection is critical to the success of the airless spraying of industrial coatings. The equipment must be capable of dependably delivering the selected coating type at the right application rate and under various operating conditions. If equipment is not properly suited for the job, quality issues and equipment failures can result, often leading to budget overruns, schedule delays and unhappy customers.

In selecting airless spraying equipment, many factors must be considered, including the available power source, the coating type, the application demand, the distance between the pump and the spray gun, the operating environment, portability and maintenance requirements. This article will focus on the pros and cons of various power sources when selecting airless spray equipment along with tips to maximize sprayer performance.

#### **POWER SOURCES**

Airless pumps can be powered by air, electric or gas power sources. The selection is often determined by the availability of power sources and the operating conditions. Key considerations of each source are shown in Table 1.

#### GENERAL TIPS FOR SELECTING AIRLESS SPRAYERS Using Gravity to Your Advantage

Inlet suction tubes can present problems when spraying high-solids, high-viscosity materials.

The pump draws material in through a 4-6-foot suction tube which can act as a straw and be extremely hard on the fluid section when trying to pull heavy material out of a bucket. A great way around that issue is to use gravity to your advantage with the use of a feed hopper. Using gravity-feeding instead of a suction hose can make the difference between being able to spray a product successfully or not. It is also difficult to fully clean suction tubes. Because a pump only draws in at 8 psi, it is difficult to fully flush all the coating from the interior walls of the suction tube, leading to a buildup over time. It is somewhat similar to an artery with plaque that builds up over time, eventually restricting the flow and adversely affecting performance. Gravity-fed hoppers are much easier to fully clean and require less solvent.

#### In Some Cases, Remove Filters

When spraying heavy-bodied materials and using larger tip sizes, the pump outlet filter and gun filter can be removed. These two filters are for one purpose only: to prevent tip clogs. Filters can act as choking points to flow when dealing with heavy materials. By selectively removing the filter, you increase your capability to spray high-viscosity materials significantly.

#### **Use Inlet Tube Strainers**

The most important filter on the sprayer is the inlet tube strainer (if you are using a suction tube). This is the one filter that keeps debris from going into the fluid section. If a rock, screw

or other debris gets into the fluid section, you may have a repair on your hands costing \$1,000 or more on parts, labor and downtime. A common misconception is that the pump outlet filter will catch that debris, but by the time it gets there, it's too late. It's already been through the fluid section—the most expensive component on the machine.

#### **Spraying Zincs**

Selecting the right setup to spray an inorganic zinc primer is probably the number-one technical issue encountered in the field. Because zinc primers are filled with zinc powder, these materials can be tricky to spray. The key is to make sure that the primer is constantly agitated or stirred using a slow-speed agitator, even while spraying. This will keep the particles in suspension.

Pumps will begin to fail when those particles settle out. If the pump will be sitting for any period of time, even five minutes, it should be depressurized. Before spraying again, material should be circulated at low pressure through the hoses and spray gun back to the container to make sure no zinc has settled in the hoses.

#### Sizing Pumps

Sizing your pump for the job at hand and jobs foreseen in the near future is key. If the materials being sprayed require a pump capable of

pumping at only 3,000 psi, then a pump near that pressure rating should be chosen. More pressure is not always better. Higher-pressure pumps use smaller pump fluid section that can wear faster. Too much pressure can also cause tips to wear faster. Likewise, if a material requires 3,500 psi at the tip to atomize, then a 45:1 pump may not have enough pressure to create a good spray pattern with 300 feet of spray hose. Consult with the material supplier and equipment manufacturer to make sure the right size pump is being specified.

#### **Q&A WITH THE AUTHORS**

# What is the most common type of power source in the field and why?

John Lihwa: The most common power source used is air (pneumatic). These sprayers can handle heavy materials such as high-solids epoxies, and in many cases can handle multiple spray guns to allow multiple painters to work at the same time off of one pump. Most industrial contractors have access to air compressors and many facilities have multiple air compressors to run blasting, painting, tools and other operations.

Josh Carney: Agreed. Most facilities have large air compressors on-site to run tools all over the shop—including sprayers. Airoperated sprayers can handle heavier materials than electric sprayers and are approved for use in explosive atmospheres when spraying solvent-based products. Air-operated sprayers are also generally less expensive than electric or gas equipment because they can run off of compressed air that is often already available.

#### Do you see that trend shifting?

Lihwa: I do not see the trend shifting with most contractors in the field. The industry is still dominated by air-powered sprayers with other power sources used in special applications. Roofing contractors, for example, often use gas-powered sprayers for silicone applications. An air-powered sprayer for a tank or tower job will still be the pump of choice since air is already needed for blasting. For a shop or facility installing a new paint booth, I would recommend considering electric sprayers. They are more efficient and would not require new piping or a new compressor to be installed. I have seen

some shops shift to electric sprayers because a new booth was built and the air capacity was not available to support another sprayer.

Carney: Plant operations remain dominated by air-operated sprayers. There is a shift in spraying heavy coatings in outdoor applications such as silicone roofing. Portability may be another factor to consider. Many contractors do not want to tow a large compressor to run their air sprayer. They would prefer to have a sprayer with a gas engine that is an all-in-one power pack—very portable.

#### If all three types were available on a jobsite, which would you recommend to a customer and why?

Lihwa: It depends on the job at hand, but for most jobs I would recommend an air-operated pump. As stated, for roofing applications, I would recommend a gas sprayer. For painters spraying drywall in a large building, where they do not want to bring a compressor inside, I would recommend an electric sprayer. This pump type is quiet because there is no compressor running. An electric sprayer is also a good choice in plants when air supply is an issue.

Carney: It definitely depends on the jobsite. For in-plant operations, an air-operated sprayer is recommended as long as compressed air is available. Without a compressor available or when spraying relatively low-viscosity material, an electric-powered sprayer may be the best choice.

#### **SUMMARY**

Power sources represent one of the key considerations in selecting airless sprayers. In addition to power sources, remember other factors when selecting an airless sprayer such as coating type, application demand,

the distance between the pump and the spray gun, the operating environment, portability and maintenance requirements. Following are some general items to consider when selecting equipment:

- Make sure you have sufficient fluid pressure at the gun to provide consistent coverage;
- A dependable, high-quality sprayer may have higher initial cost, but successful

- completion of more jobs on time is possible if you consider all the right factors;
- Durable sprayers can perform in a variety of environmental conditions and make the difference between a good day's work and a day of frustrating delays; and
- Work with a qualified technical representative to make the right choice.

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

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
